

RULES & REGULATIONS

SHOW AREA DEFINED:

"South-West Donegal:" the name of this Agricultural Show means the area included in the Parishes of Ardara, Glenties, Upper Rosses, Inver, Killybegs (Killaghtee), Kilcar and Glencolumbkille.

- Competition is Open except where defined as above or confined to Ardara Parish
- Exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor for at least six months before date of Show and in Confined Classes must be domiciled in the stated area for that period.
- Exhibits in the Farm and Garden Produce, Industrial Sections, must have been grown by the exhibitor



- 4. The Show Secretary, acting through her officers, may refuse an entry without assigning any reason.
- 5. The Show Executive while cataloguing the exhibits will not accept liability for any error in the numbering of the exhibits, for any exhibit not being properly displayed, or for loss of, accident or damage to an exhibit.
- 6. The judges may withhold a prize in any class in which in their opinion, there is not sufficient merit. The judges' decision to "merit" will be final.
- All trophies are perpetual unless otherwise specified and cannot be won outright.
- 8. Entry Fee must be paid when entering. All entries must be received on or before the closing date. No late entries accepted.
- 9. In the case of only one exhibit in a Class, the Judge may award a 1st prize if in his/her opinion the quality is high enough, otherwise a merit may be awarded.
- 10. In Classes where there are ten or more entries the Judges may award an additional prize, if exhibits in their opinion warrant such an award; 4th prize is equal to 3rd prize.
- 11. Animals for exhibition at the Show must be in the Show Grounds at least 30 minutes before judging commences in their section, must be haltered and trained to the lead.
- 12. No exhibit will be removed from the Show Grounds without permission from the Chief Steward whose name will appear in the Show Catalogue.
- 13. Any statement re ownership wrongly and intentionally made in the Entry Form (in the opinion of the Executive Committee) automatically disqualifies the exhibitor.
- 14. All prizes must be claimed on the day of Show.
- 15. As judging starts in the marquee at 10 am, all exhibits in the Industrial, Vegetable, Farm Produce, Butter, Eggs, Fruit, Honey, Cake, Jam, and Flower Sections must be in the marquee before 9.30 am on date of Show.



- 16. The Show Society reserves the right to postpone the Show or part thereof, definitely or indefinitely, without incurring any liability to any exhibitor or other party exhibitor or other party.
- 17. N.B. Prize-winning exhibits at previous Shows in Ardara will not be eligible for any of the Competitions in the Industrial Section and must not be entered.
- 18. Exhibits not to be removed from the marguee before 5pm.
- 19. Only entries accepted by the Secretary are eligible for judging.
- New members shall not be entitled to vote until the meeting following acceptance of membership.
- 21. No entry will be accepted from anyone who fails to return trophies on time.
- In accordance with Irish Shows Association Rule 5% of the prize money must be deducted in all cattle, horse and sheep classes and forwarded to them, to help defray their costs.
- 23. Exhibitors are required to pay admission charge. If your entry fee is €80 or more you will receive 2 Show field passes.
- 24. Any person who interfered in any way with a judge will forfeit any prizes he/she may have won in any section of the Show, and will be barred from entering or exhibiting at Ardara Show for a period that will be determined by the Executive Committee.
- 25. Any Entry not in place by the stated time will not be judged.
- 26. The general public will not be permitted in the Marquee during judging.
- During judging stewards will not accompany judges in sections where they have entries.
- 28. Shows and competitors must contact the I.S.A. for all details and information concerning these Championships and not the sponsor.



- 29. The committee reserves the right to cancel a class based on insufficient numbers, if this happens all entry money will be returned.
- 30. Any objections or complaints must be lodged in writing with the I.S.A. representative at the show and the Show Secretary within half an hour following the completion of the competition, together with €50 or other stated fee which is refundable in the event of the objection being upheld.
- 31. All cattle are strictly commercial unless otherwise stated.
- 32. No Calves allowed in the No Permanent Teeth Section.
- 33. All exhibitors are responsible for their own entries and ensuring they are entered in their proper class.
- 34. The show society retains the right to adjust any classes as they see fit on the day of the show.



THE IRISH SHOWS ASSOCIATION

The Irish Shows Association are proud to present the following Championships and wishes to acknowledge the generous sponsorships, which make these competitions possible.

For the efficient running of the championships all concerned are requested to read and observe the Rules set out below.

GENERAL RULES FOR 2017

A ELIGIBILITY OF SHOWS

Shows wishing to participate in the 2017 championship and be eligible to hold qualifiers must have collected the Championship fund Levy (currently 5%) from Horse, Pony, Cattle and Sheep class prize money for the year 2016 and forwarded the amount so collected, in full to the Irish shows Association Head Office within the stipulated period of not more than 30 days from the date of their show. Alternative methods of meeting this obligation are not acceptable.

Any show or competitor in breach of the Rules set out below will be disqualified from participating or competing in these championships.

These General Rules and those relating to individual championships (where applicable) should be published in the show schedule and catalogue of the participating shows and must be strictly observed.

B QUALIFYING ROUNDS: (QUALIFIERS)

Qualifying rounds will take place at eligible shows selected by the Irish Shows Association.

C RESPONSIBILITY OF SHOWS HOLDING QUALIFYING ROUNDS

- Selected shows should hold a separate class for each qualifier from which the highest placed animals will qualify.
- b. The qualifier class should be held as the 1st class in the relevant section of show.
- Shows must ensure that the qualifiers are held strictly in accordance with the relevant rules.
- d. No other sponsor may be involved in qualifying classes.
- e. Shows may charge an entry fee for each qualifying class. The I.S.A. will award a rosette to the successful animal(s) on appearance at the final.
- f. No show hosting a Championship Final may hold a qualifier for that Championship on the day of the Final other than by agreement with the Irish Shows Association.



- g. Animals qualified for finals are not eligible to enter in any other class at the Show where the Final is held other than a Qualifying Class for another Competition.
- h. Shows should appoint competent well-briefed persons to act as Stewards, who must ensure that only animals (or other exhibits) which are eligible to compete and those whose documentation is in order are allowed to proceed to the judging ring.
- i. Animal Passports should be read by a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the show.
- j. On completion of judging, Stewards must instruct the successful competitors to attend at the Show Secretary's Office, within one hour and to complete the necessary documentation for entry to the championship final.
- k. The show must appoint a well-briefed officer, who will be in attendance at the Secretary's Office, and who will assist exhibitors to complete the necessary documentation for participation in the final and to collect the relevant entrance fee.
- I. Show Secretaries must forward complete result cards, together with appropriate fees to the I.S.A. within three days following the holding of the show.

D RESPONSIBILITY OF EXHIBITORS

- a. Exhibitors accept that the Judges decision is final in all cases. Any abuse of Judges will not be tolerated. Where a dispute or case for complaint arises the matter should only be dealt with under (f). below.
- Winners of qualifiers are themselves responsible for entering their animals (or exhibits) for the final, in accordance with j. and k. above, within one hour of qualifying.
- c. Winners of qualifiers will compete in the final.
- d. The I.S.A. in conjunction with the sponsor reserve the right to alter or amend the rules of any competition as may be necessary or appropriate.
- e. Shows and competitors must contact the National Irish Shows Office for details of any championships and not the sponsor involved.
- f. Objections must be lodged in writing with the I.S.A. representative at the show or the Show Secretary within half an hour following the completion of judging, together with €50 or other stated fee which is refundable in the event of the objection being upheld.
- g. Any exhibitor who makes a false declaration or misrepresents a fact regarding themselves or their exhibit are liable to disqualification and or forfeiture of any prizes awarded.

E RESPONSIBILITY OF SHOWS HOSTING CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS

- a. A deduction of 5% of the prize money is to be collected by the show and forwarded to the I.S.A. within 30 days of the final.
- b. Championship finals must start not later than 2pm on the day of the show and the advertised time of starting must be adhered to as far as practicable. If necessary, other show classes should be either postponed or relocated to allow for this.



NOTICES OF INTEREST TO CHAMPIONSHIP PARTICIPANTS

(IRISH LAW (EU DIRECTIVE)

Under Irish law all horses moving from one location to another must be accompanied by their passports. It is in your own interest to ensure this is the case. Failure to do so is an offence under Irish Law and is liable on summary conviction to result in a fine of up to €3,000. All passports must be registered with the name of the current owner.

- Embryo Transfer: Where a foal is produced by this method the dams passport
 must bear a declaration dated, stamped and signed by the stallion owner (or ac
 credited practitioner where Al is involved) stating the date on which the dam was
 last covered (or inseminated) and the name of the covering stallion.
- The owners of Champions and Reserve Champions are invited to submit the animals' passports to the I.S.A. head office where the placing will be endorsed and officially stamped with the seal of the I.S.A. as a permanent record.
- It is in the interest of shows hosting championship finals that photographs and results are forwarded to the Irish Farmers Journal immediately following judging.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ANIMAL OWNERS INVOLVED IN SHOWING ANIMALS

The I.S.A. would advise all Animal owners who have their Animals insured to have the Insurance cover extended to cover them while showing Animals at Shows. We understand that it costs very little or nothing at all depending on who you have Insurance cover with.

If you are one of the few who don't have cover we would advise that you think about putting it in place for this purpose. It may be well worthwhile.

The reason for us giving you this advice is to protect yourself in the event of your animal lashing out, and injuring someone or damaging someone's property, if that were to happen, and it is established that your animal was out of your control you may be held responsible, or partly responsible for any injury or damage caused and may end up paying all, or part of any settlement reached.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ORGANISERS AND EXHIBITORS AT LIVESTOCK SHOWS, 2017 GENERAL

Show organisers should notify the SVI at their local DVO of the intention to hold a show and provide the location and proposed dates of the show. <u>Keeper herd numbers for Agricultural Shows must be obtained in advance from NBAS Division, Administration Building, Backweston Laboratory Campus, Backweston, Celbridge, Co Kildare - Telephone (01) 5058600.</u>

SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS - CATTLE

Animal Health Status

T.B.

All animals must come from herds, which are Officially TB free (OTF) (i.e. not restricted), and the herd and relevant animals must have had a clear test within the previous twelve months. No pre-movement test is required for T.B. However, it is recommended by the Department that a 30-day pre-movement test for TB should apply to all Shows.

Brucellosis

- (a) All animals must come from herds which are Officially Brucellosis free (OBF) (i.e. not restricted).
- (b) Certain animals (i.e. females aged 18 months and over and bulls aged 24 months and over) must have passed a test for Brucellosis within the previous 60 days. However, these animals may move to any number of Shows within the validity period of the same 60-day pre-movement test.

Where such an animal(s) is/are being shown repeatedly during successive 60-day validity periods, in the course of a Show season, the animal(s) may be allowed to move on foot of Permit ER 36A during the unexpired portion of a valid test where the animal is under test for the next validity period and the identity card/passport is held by the DVO/practitioner.

Identification

All cattle must bear two plastic tags with the same number (one in each ear) as issued under the Department's identification system. They must be accompanied by their passports (except in the circumstances outlined in the preceding subparagraph).

Bulls for A.I. Stations

In addition to the T.B. and Brucellosis tests, bulls destined for A.I. stations must be tested for I.B.R. (Infectious Bovine Rhynotracheitis), E.B.L. (Enzootic Bovine Leukosis), B.V.D. (Bovine Virus Diarrhoea) and Johnes Disease, within 30 days prior to movement into such stations.

AIM Notification

The movement of cattle to and from an Agricultural Show within the State must be recorded on AIM. Form CMMS 4 (available from local DVOs) shall be used for all except animals imported directly to the show (see below). Ultimate responsibility for fulfilling this requirement lies with the Show Secretary.

The keeper of the animal(s) should complete sections 2 and 3(a) of the CMMS 4 form while Section 3(b) should be completed by the Show Secretary. Completed forms should be sent



to the District Veterinary Office in the county where the Show is being held within 7 days of movement.

Imports from Northern Ireland

It is very important that any proposal to import cattle to a show is made known to the local District Veterinary Office well in advance so that consideration can be given to compliance with the requirements outlined below.

Premises

The Show premises at which the cattle will reside for the duration of their stay must either be an assembly centre approved for exports or of such a standard as being capable of being approved for such a purpose temporarily. A fundamental requirement for such premises is that they have surfaces that are capable of being cleaned and disinfected, and have adequate cleaning and disinfection facilities. Adequate segregation facilities may be required also (see under "Status of Animals" below).

Status of Animals

Cattle from Northern Ireland being moved to a show must be certified in accordance with the normal requirements for intra-community trade in breeding animals including having passed a TB test (export interpretation) during the 30 days prior to export and a brucellosis test in the case of eligible animals (females and entire males over 12 months) during the 30 days prior to leaving the herd of origin.

To comply with eligibility requirements for re-importation into Northern Ireland after the show, cattle must not mix with any cattle of a lesser health status whilst at the show. This can be achieved in one of two ways:

- (I) either the imported animals are kept segregated fully from other cattle at the show which have not been tested, or
- (ii) all cattle attending the show must have been TB (export interpretation) within 30 days and all cattle from Northern Ireland attending the show must have been brucellosis tested within 30 days as set out above.

Documentation

Cattle imported to a show from Northern Ireland must be accompanied by an original breeding animal intra-trade health certificate (known as a TRACES certificate) and a passport for each animal. A TRACES message, corresponding with the TRACES certificate, will be sent for each animal or consignment being dispatched to the show (this will be performed by officials in the dispatching country).

For the return journey, this original certificate must be endorsed by the signature of the official veterinarian of the Department at the show, together with the official stamp of the competent authority and date of endorsement. A TRACES message will be sent for the return journey also (this will be performed by Department officials In addition, a non-comminglement certificate must be issued by the official veterinarian for the show at or before return, stating that the animal shows no clinical signs of disease and has not been in contact, during its stay at the show/event, with animals of a lesser health status. The passport must accompany the animal on the return journey also.

The Show Secretary should complete a CMMS 5 form in respect of animals imported to



take part in the Show. The owner of the imported animal(s) is required to sign the form also when the animal arrives at the Show and provide his/her herd number. Following the Show, the official veterinarian should complete the bottom portion of the CMMS 5 form also confirming that he has stamped the official Health Certificate and that he has issued a Non-Comminglement Certificate.

The completed CMMS 5 form should then be forwarded to NBAS Division, Administration Building, Backweston Campus, Backweston, Celbridge, Co. Kildare to enable recording of the movement. A carbon copy of the form will be provided for the Show Secretary, the official veterinarian and the herd keeper of the animal(s).

CMMS 5 forms are available from local District Veterinary Offices (DVOs) or from the Cattle Movement Notification Agency, Clonakilty, Co Cork.

Identification

All sheep must be identified individually with appropriate ear tags issued in accordance with the requirements of the National Sheep Identification System (NSIS).

Movement Documentation

All consignments of sheep being moved must be accompanied by a completed dispatch document. Individual details of each sheep in the consignment must be recorded on the document. Sheep from non-restricted flocks only can be moved to shows. In the case of flocks restricted following diagnosis of scrapie, sheep possessing the ARR/ARR genotype only may be exhibited. The movement of these ARR/ARR genotype sheep must be accompanied by the relevant movement permit (SCR/10), which can be obtained from the local District Veterinary Office in the county where the flock is located.

AIM Notification

The movement of sheep to and from an Agricultural Show within the State must be recorded on AIM. This is done using a copy of the owners sheep dispatch document as follows:

The owner/keeper presents the signed and completed dispatch document with (i) the show number,

(ii) the date of the move back to the source holding (iii) stamps it with the show stamp and (iv) signs the dispatch document.

The show secretary keeps white copy for his/her records.

The source/destination keeper keeps the bottom yellow copy to enter it into their flock register. Ultimate responsibility for fulfilling this requirement lies with the Show Secretary

Flock Register

All movements of sheep to and from shows must be recorded in the keeper's flock register.

Exports to Northern Ireland

All sheep must be accompanied by a TRACES intra-community trade certificate for ovine animals. A TRACES message, corresponding with the TRACES certificate, will be sent for each animal or consignment being dispatched to the show (this will be performed by Department officials of the DVO). Exhibitors are advised to contact the show society in Northern Ireland well in advance of any show to determine the suitability of the show for return of animals (e.g. premises and sheep status), and whether the authorities will have officials and veterinary staff present to supervise and process documentation for animals returning to origin.
